HOMEBOUND INSTRUCTION

Homebound instruction is provided to students who are unable to attend school due to medical, emotional, or disciplinary problems. Homebound instruction strives to keep a student on pace to rejoin his/her class and maintain academic progress. Secondary students receive instruction for two hours per day, elementary students receive one hour per day. Students receive credit for their work while on homebound instruction.

The District makes provisions for homebound instruction according to the following guidelines:

1. If an inquiry is received from the parent of a student who is expected to be out of school for a minimum of two weeks, the District will approve homebound instruction, provided that the student's parents/guardians submit a copy of a letter from their physician to the building principal confirming the student's inability to attend school.
2. If a student is in the hospital and is able (physically, emotionally, and psychologically) to undertake school work, the District will provide hospital-bound instruction.
3. If a student is awaiting placement by the Committee on Special Education (CSE) and is not enrolled in other District-approved programs, the District will provide homebound instruction.
